What is Heat Stress ...

Heat stress is adverse health effects that occur while working in hot and/or humid environments or A condition in which the body is unable to cool itself enough to maintain a health temperature.

When heat is combined with other stresses such as physical work, loss of fluids, fatigue or some medical conditions, it may lead to heat-related injury. This can happen to anybody- even if you are young and fit.

Signs and symptoms of Heat stress include:

Change in personality: increased irritability is often observed as the lack of water starts affecting the body and brain functions.

Loss of concentration and ability to do mental tasks or skilled tasks by means of loss of dexterity

Thirst, Headache, Nausea, stomach pain, weakness, dizziness, flushed skin Fatigue, dark urine and Heat intolerance.

The common symptoms which we must all be aware of when it comes to Heat Stress are: These include: mild to severe and needing immediate medical attention.

<u>Heat Rash</u> – <u>Manifested by</u> red bumpy rash with severe itching usually in places where the skin rubs together like under arms and between legs. <u>Remedy by</u>: Wash skin regularly to keep clean and dry. Move to a cooler environment if possible. Change into dry clothes.

<u>Heat Cramp</u> –<u>Manifested by</u> uncontrolled muscle cramping, muscle shaking during or a few hours after work or exercise is performed. Make sure to stay hydrated and eat a well-balanced diet. It will give your body all the electrolytes and salt it needs.

<u>Heat Exhaustion</u> – Serious condition, <u>Manifested by</u>: Heavy sweating, cool moist skin, body temperature over 100.5F. Weak pulse, normal or low blood pressure. Person is tired, weak, clumsy, upset or confused, is very thirsty or is panting or breathing rapidly, vision may be blurred. <u>Remedy by:</u> Move EE to shaded area, lie down with feet elevated, apply wet cloths and fan vigorously, Drink water or watered-down electrolytes drink. Seek medical attention if condition does not improve or worsens.

Heat Stroke –This is the most Severe Heat Stress symptom. It is manifested by: NO sweating, high body temperature (over 105F.), hot dry, red skin, person acting strangely, confused, upset, weak, fast pulse, a headache or dizziness. In later stages person may pass out and have convulsions. Remedy by: Call 911 and request ambulance. Seek immediate medical attention, assess need for CPR. Move to a cool area, loosen clothing and make person lie down. Apply cold packs to the neck and arm pits. If the person is conscious offer sips of cool water.





Directions

North Side Sportsmen's Association is located at: 325 Mt. Pleasant Road Warrendale, PA 15086

Traveling North on I-79

Exit I-79 at exit 75 Warrendale. Turn right off of exit. Follow Red Belt and go straight through traffic light and across Rt. 19 to next stop sign. Turn left on to North Gate road. At Warrendale Fire Hall (about 150 yards from previous stop sign), turn right onto Mt Pleasant Road. The club is on the left approximately 1 mile from the fire hall.

Traveling South on I-79

Exit I-79 at exit 76 Cranberry. Travel South on Rt. 19 to stop light at Warrendale road (Red Belt). Turn left and proceed from that point as described in directions above.

Traveling on the turnpike

Take Exit 3. Travel south on 19 for 3 lights. At the third light, turn left at the 7/11 Exxon station onto Warrendale road. Turn left at stop sign onto Northgate Rd. and then right at Warrendale Fire Hall and Camelot onto Mt. Pleasant Rd. The club is on left approximately 1 mile.
